# DIRECTIONS FOR ALERT LEVEL 3 REGARDING MEASURES TO ADDRESS, PREVENT AND COMBAT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19 RELATING TO THE FORESTRY SECTOR

I, Barbara Dallas Creecy, Minister of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment hereby issue the Directions for Alert Level 3 set out in the Schedule in terms of regulation 4(10) of the Regulations issued by the Minister of Co-operative Governance and Traditional Affairs in terms of section 27(2) of the Disaster Management Act, 2002 (Act No. 57 of 2002) and published on 29 April 2020 in Government Notice No. R. 480 of Government *Gazette* No. 43258.

#### SCHEDULE

#### 1. Definitions

In these Directions, any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Regulations and the National Forests Act bears the meaning so assigned and, unless the context otherwise indicates—.

"National Forests Act" means the National Forests Act, 1998 (Act No. 84 of 1998);

"Regulations" means the Regulations issued in terms of section 27(2) of the Disaster Management Act, 2002 (Act No. 57 of 2002) and published on 29 April 2020 in Government Notice No. R.480 of Government Gazette No. 43258.

# 2. Purpose

The purpose of these Directions is to curtail the threat posed by the COVID-19 pandemic and to alleviate, contain and minimise the effects of the national state of disaster, and to ensure fair processes, especially with regard to specified licencing, evaluation of licence applications, inspections and issuing of licenses in terms of the National Forests Act.

## 3. Application

These Directions apply to—

- (a) issuing authorities responsible for the processes listed in Annexure 1; and
- (b) all applicants and holders of licenses related to the matters dealt with in Annexure 1.

#### 4. Activities

Issuing authorities will receive and process applications in the manner indicated in Annexure 1 to these Directions.

#### 5. Commencement

These Directions come into effect on the date of publication in the Government Gazette.

### **ANNEXURE 1**

# Services to be provided by issuing authorities in terms of the National Forests Act

#### General provisions:

- 1. The provision of services indicated in the table below, in addition to the specific restrictions indicated in the table, is subject to all the applicable health and safety and other restrictions, directions and requirements determined in terms of section 27(2) of the Disaster Management Act, 2002 (Act No. 57 of 2002).
- 2. If there is any uncertainty about whether a service is restricted, the relevant official of the particular authority should be approached for guidance and/or confirmation.
- 3. For purposes of clarity, a licence required in terms of the National Forests Act is hereafter referred to as a licence.
